<p>Science - Show what you have learned about materials <u>Ideas</u> Make a collection of objects or toys and sort them by the material they are made of. Make cheese on toast or scrambled eggs and watch how the heat changes the ingredients; test different materials to see which is best for making a bag to carry things</p>	<p>History – show what you have learned about the Great Fire of London <u>Ideas</u> Visit the Museum of London or St Pauls or the Monument and write about your trip; write a story pretending you are an eyewitness; write an information report about the fire; find out more about the plague or London in 1666 or King Charles II</p>	<p>Art– show what you have learned about collage <u>Ideas</u> Find out about artists who used collage, such as Matisse or Eric Carle; Make your own collage picture using different materials – you could cut out different shades of red from magazines or make a collage of faces</p>
<p>English – show what you have learned about fire stories <u>Ideas</u> Find out about fire myths from other cultures such as Greece, North America or New Zealand. Write your own story about how fire was invented.</p>	<p>Maths – show what you have learned about division <u>Ideas</u> Find some division fact families ($2 \times 5 = 10$, $5 \times 2 = 10$, $10 \div 5 = 2$, $10 \div 2 = 5$). Make a collection of toys and share them equally;</p>	<p>R.E – show what you have learned about special books <u>Ideas</u> Find out about the special books of other religions, such as Jews or Sikhs; read, retell and illustrate your favourite Bible story; design a front cover for a Bible or a Qu'ran</p>
<p>PSHE – show what you have learned about fire safety <u>Ideas</u> Make a fire safety poster; Find out about the fire brigade and the job of a firefighter; Check your smoke alarms work; Teach your family about what to do in a fire.</p>	<p>Maths – show what you have learned about weighing (mass) <u>Ideas</u> Find some tins and packets and look at the weight on the outside; sort them into more and less than 1 kg; bake a cake and use the scales to help you weigh the ingredients</p>	<p><u>Other fire ideas:</u> Find out about dragons; Write a fire poem; listen to The Firebird by Stravinsky and make up a dance;</p>
