- Our number of the week is 10. We explained to the children that when we write number 10 it has 2 digits. The 1 represents that we have 1 ten and the 0 represents that there are no ones. We no longer teach tens and units but tens and ones.
- We have continued to learn the Ugly Duckling song and are doing really well with it.
- We have had great fun acting out the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. Some of us have been making bridges in the outside area for the goats to travel across.

Last week we completed all of the single letters from Letters and Sounds Phase 2 and 3.

We always teach the children the letter q with the letter u together.

Your child has also been taught 3 consonant digraphs

ch, sh and th

Perhaps you could look out for words that have these digraphs when you read together. Also please check that your child is pronouncing the words correctly. Very often children say a 'v' sound at the beginning of a word beginning with 'th'.
