Freedom of Information Publication Scheme

For the purpose of the Scheme Littleton Church of England Infant School will be referred to as "the school".

The governing body is responsible for maintenance of this scheme.

1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they make available.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;
- The manner in which the information will be published; and
- Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is available in paper form obtainable from the school.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information. There are clear exemptions to the requirement to produce information on demand, so as to protect confidential/sensitive/personal data, for example about children or members of staff.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

2. Categories of information published

The publication scheme guides you to information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 5 of this scheme.

The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas:

- School Prospectus Information – information published on the School website

- Governors' Documents – information published in the Governors Annual Report and in other governing body documents
- Children & Curriculum – information about policies that relate to children and the school curriculum including references to child records and incident logs.
- School Policies and other information related to the school - information about policies that relate to the school in general.

3. How to request information

Governors' Annual Report	Schools are required to produce a Governor's Annual Report to Parents
Instrument of Government and Constitution Details	<p>The instrument of Government is the document which records the name and category of the school and the name and constitution of its governing body.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The name of the school • The category of the school • The name of the governing body • The manner in which the governing body is constituted • The term of office of each category of governor if less than 4 years • The full names of individual governors • The dates of all full governing body meetings that individual governors have attended in the current and previous school year • The name of any Body entitled to appoint any category of governor • Details of any trust • If the school has a religious character, a description of the ethos • The date the instrument takes effect
Minutes of meeting of the governing body and its committees	Agreed minutes of meetings of the governing body and its committees

Class	Description
Home – school agreement	Statement of the school's aims and values, the school's responsibilities, the parental responsibilities and the school's expectations of its pupils for example homework arrangements
Curriculum Policy	Statement on following the policy for the secular curriculum subjects and religious education and schemes of work and syllabuses currently used by the school
Sex Education Policy	Statement of policy with regard to sex and relationship education

Special Education Needs Policy	Information about the school's policy on providing for pupils with special educational needs
E-Safety and Internet Access Policy	Information on the school's policy on internet safety
RE Policy	Information on the school's policy and the right of parents to withdraw children.
Accessibility Plans	Plan for increasing participation of disabled pupils in the school's curriculum, improving the accessibility of the physical environment and improving delivery of information to disabled pupils.
Accessibility and Equal Opportunities Policy	Statement of policy for promoting equality, including race and gender equality
Collective Worship	Statement of arrangements for the required daily act of collective worship
Child Protection Policy	Statement of policy for safeguarding and promoting welfare of pupils at the school
Behaviour Policy	Statement of general principles on behaviour and discipline and of measures taken by the head teacher to prevent bullying.
Attendance Policy	Statement of policy regarding pupil attendance at school
Administration of Medicine Policy	Statement of policy with regard to children who are unwell and to clarify the responsibilities for the medical care of pupils
Other documents	Many other policies and documents are available on request

Class	Description
Published reports of Ofsted referring expressly to the school	Published report of the last inspection of the school and the letter to the children from the lead inspector.
Charging and Remissions Policies	A statement of the school's policy with respect to charges and remissions for any optional extra or board and lodging for which charges are permitted, for example school publications, music tuition, trips
School session times and term dates	Details of school session and dates of school terms and holidays
Health and Safety Policy and risk assessment	Statement of general policy with respect to health and safety at work of employees (and others) and the organisation and arrangements for carrying out the policy
Complaints procedure	Statement of procedures for dealing with complaints
Appraisal Policy	Statement of procedures adopted by the governing body relating to the performance management of staff and the annual report of the head teacher on the effectiveness of appraisal procedures
Disciplinary & Capability Policy and Procedure	Statement of procedure for regulating conduct and discipline of school staff and procedures by which staff may seek redress for grievance
Safer Recruiting Policy	Statement of policy regarding recruitment of all school staff
Equal Opportunities in Employment Policy	Statement of policy regarding equal opportunities in recruitment and employment
Attendance Management Policy & Procedure	Procedures for recording and dealing with staff absences

Special Leave of Absence Policy	Statement of policy regarding leave of absence
Pay Policy	Statement of policy regarding staff pay
Whistleblowing (or Confidential Reporting) Policy	Statement of policy regarding reporting unacceptable practice or behaviour where the welfare of children, staff or public may be at risk
Allegations of Abuse against Staff	Procedures for allegations of abuse against staff
Grievance Policy & Procedure	Procedures for staff seeking redress for a grievance arising from their work
