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Our Learning Journey

In English we imagined we were an eyewitness to the Great Fire of London. We used our senses to describe what we could see, hear, smell and touch. We then wrote a diary as if we were at the Great Fire.

In maths we have been learning about fractions. This week we have focused on learning about equal/unequal groups, recognising and finding a half and a quarter.

In history we have been investigating some of the ways in which London has changed since 1666. We looked at houses, transport, jobs and what London would have looked like at night now and then.

In science we have been learning how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

In art we started to make a collage of the Great Fire of London. We are looking forward to finishing them next week.
